# About Toronto

Toronto is the biggest city in Canada and the common capital of Ontario. With a populace of 2,731,571, it is the fourth-biggest city in North America after Mexico City, New York City, and Los Angeles. Toronto is the focal point of the Greater Toronto Area, the most crowded metropolitan territory in Canada, and grapples the Golden Horseshoe, a vigorously urbanized district that is home to 8.7 million individuals, or around 26% of Canada's populace. A worldwide city, Toronto is a universal focal point of business, back, expressions, and culture and generally perceived as a standout amongst the most multicultural and cosmopolitan urban areas on the planet.

Native people groups have occupied the territory for a huge number of years, the southern end of an old trail driving north to Lake Simcoe and Lake Huron. Changeless European settlement of the zone goes back to 1787, when British authorities arranged the Toronto Purchase with the Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation. The British built up the Town of York, and later assigned it as the capital of Upper Canada. Amid the War of 1812, the town was the site of the Battle of York and endured substantial harm by U.S. troops. York was renamed and joined as the City of Toronto in 1834, and turned into the capital of the region of Ontario in 1867. The city has since extended past its unique fringes through amalgamation with encompassing districts at different circumstances in its history to its present territory of 630.2 km<sup>2</sup>.
