Sydney, the capital of recent South Wales and one amongst Australia's largest cities, is best celebrated for its harbour front state capital opera, with a particular sail-like style. large Darling Harbour and therefore the smaller Circular pier port are hubs of bank life, with the arched Harbour Bridge and honoured Royal biological science Garden near . State capital Tower's out of doors platform, the walkway, offers 360-degree views of town and suburbs. State capital is Australia's safest town and therefore the fifth safest within the world, per The Economist's 2019 Safe Cities Index. National capital took out the highest position for the third year during a row, with Singapore, Osaka, and national capital creating up the opposite prime 5 safest cities worldwide. The ranking is judged per crime rates, public health, digital and infrastructure security, hospital quality, terrorist act risk, natural disasters, and road traffic deaths, similarly as forty nine different applied math indicators. the sole different Australian town to form the index, that featured sixty cities from round the world, was Melbourne, that placed tenth. Its score for infrastructure security, health security, and digital security matched that of Sydney's however it fell short in terms of non-public security. Toronto, Washington, Copenhagen, and national capital all placed Melbourne within the top.
