Sydney, the capital of New South Wales, Australia is known as the Harbor City. It's the largest, city with a population of around 4 million. It has an enviable reputation as one of the world's most beautiful and lies amid a seductive intermingling of land and sea. Sydney is a major global city and one of the most important cities for finance in the Asia-Pacific. Sydney is built around a huge harbor and hosts many tourist attractions as well as a number of beaches, bays and a couple of national parks. Brimming with history, nature, culture, art, fashion, cuisine, design, Sydney's set next to miles of ocean coastline and sandy surf beaches.
