### Young Researchers Forum


- Present your research through oral presentations

# About Birmingham

Birmingham is located on the small River Rea in the West Midlands of England. Birmingham is a metropolitan borough and the largest most populous British city outside London.

Birmingham acquired international prominence with the worldwide advances in science, technology and economic development producing a series of innovations that laid many of the foundations of modern industrial society.

The city is a major international commercial center, ranked as a gamma+ world city by the Globalization and World Cities Research Network and an important transport, retail, events and conference hub.

There are several major National Health Service hospitals in Birmingham. The Queen Elizabeth Hospital, adjacent to the Birmingham Medical School in Edgbaston, houses the largest critical care unit in Europe.

There are 571 parks within Birmingham— more than any other European city – totalling over 3,500 hectares (14 sq mi) of public open space. The city has over six million trees,[118] and 250 miles (400 kilometres) of urban brooks and streams.Sutton Park, which covers 2,400 acres (971 ha) in the north of the city, is the largest urban park in Europe and a National Nature Reserve.
