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OPT-MOM: Oro-Pharyngeal Therapy with Mother's Own Milk to Protect Extremely Premature Infants against Infectious Morbidities.

Dr Nancy Rodriguez,NorthShore University
Health System, USA

Dr. Nancy Rodriguez is a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner at the NorthShore University Health System and a Senior Clinician Researcher at the Pritzker School of Medicine, University of Chicago. She received a BSN from Loyola University, an MS in Nursing Administration from Aurora University, an MSN in the Neonatal Nurse Practitioner specialty and also a PhD from Rush University, Chicago IL. Her dissertation introduced the concept of "oropharyngeal administration of colostrum" into the medical literature, and she is currently leading a multi-center RCT to investigate the immune effects and clinical outcomes of extremely premature infants who receive the OPT-MOM intervention.

He authored more than 70 publications in more than 4 languages about the classification and therapy of toe walk, as well as 10 more papers about gait anomalies. Additionally, he authored 2 books about Idiopathic Toe Walk; including the world's first-ever book about ITW. David Pomarino also became known as the inventor of the pyramid insole for which he holds the patent. For his dedication and his research work he was awarded an honorary doctorate by the "Colegio medico de La Paz".

Sir Roy Calne, University of Cambridge, UK

Sir Roy Yorke Calne, Fellow of The Royal Society, is a surgeon and pioneer in organ transplantation since 1959. He performed the world's first liver, heart, and lung transplant in 1987. This was in collaboration with Professor John Wallwork at Papworth Hospital, Cambridge. He was awarded the 2012 Lasker-DeBakey Clinical Medical Research Award with Dr Thomas Starzl for the development of liver transplantation. Sir Roy was Harkness Fellow at Harvard Medical School from 1960-61 and Professor of Surgery at Cambridge University between 1965 and 1998. In 2014 he was awarded the Pride of Britain Award for Lifetime Achievement. Sir Roy works at the National University of Singapore, involved in the development of gene and stem cell therapy for the treatment of diabetes. This is in collaboration, with The Department of Haematology, University College, London; the Department of Pathology, Cambridge University; and Dick White Referrals (Specialist Veterinary Centre, Newmarket, Cambridge).
