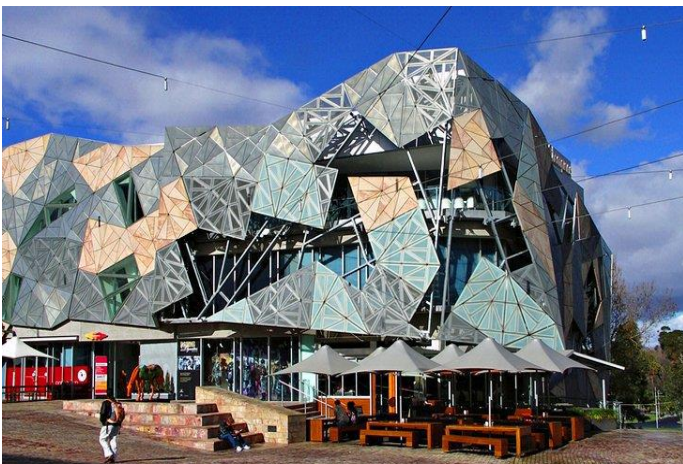
About Melbourne

Melbourne is the state capital of Victoria and the second-most populous city in **Australia** and **Oceania**.

Because Melbourne rates highly in education, entertainment, health care, research and development, tourism and sport, the EIU (Economist Intelligence Unit) consistently ranks it the world's most liveable city. It is a leading financial centre in the Asia-Pacific region and ranks among the top 15 cities in the world in the Global Financial Centres Index. The Port of Melbourne is Australia's busiest seaport for containerised and general cargo. Melbourne has an extensive transport network.

Melbourne has a highly diversified economy with particular strengths in finance, manufacturing, research, IT, education, logistics, transportation and tourism.

Tourism plays an important role in Melbourne's economy, with about 7.6 million domestic visitors and 1.88 million international visitors in 2004. In 2008, Melbourne overtook Sydney with the amount of money that domestic tourists spent in the city, accounting for around AU\$15.8 billion annually. Melbourne has been attracting an increasing share of domestic and international conference markets.



Melbourne City Attractions



Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria are botanic gardens across two sites Melbourne and Cranbourne. Melbourne Gardens was founded in 1846 when land was reserved on the south side of the Yarra River for a new botanic garden. It extends across 36 hectares that slope to the river with trees, garden beds, lakes and lawns. It displays almost 50,000 individual plants representing 8,500 different species. These are displayed in 30 living plant collections.

The Eureka Tower is a residential tower block complex on a 52,724ft² site in the South Bank suburb of Port Philip, Melbourne, Australia. The tower was developed as a joint venture between Grocon, Tab Fried, Nonda Katsalidis and Karl Fender who all combined to form a company, Eureka Tower Pty Ltd, which owns the tower. The tower is named after the Eureka Stockade rebellion during the 1854 Victoria gold rush. The horizontal lines on the building represent the markings on a ruler and the blue façade with white lines is supposed to represent the blue and white flag of the stockade.



Federation Square is a venue for arts, culture and public events on the edge of the CBD of Melbourne. It covers an area of 3.2 ha at the intersection of Flinders Street and Swanston Street built above busy railway lines and across the road from Flinders Street station. It incorporates major cultural institutions such as the Ian Potter Centre and ACMI and Koorie Heritage Trust as well as cafes and bars in a series of buildings centred around a large paved square, and a glass walled atrium.

Melbourne City Attractions



The Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG) also known simply as "The G", is an Australian sports stadium located in Yarra Park, Melbourne, Victoria. Home to the Melbourne Cricket Club, it is the 10th largest stadium in the world, the largest in Australia, the largest in the Southern Hemisphere, the largest cricket ground by capacity, and has the tallest light towers of any sporting venue. The MCG is within walking distance of the city center and is served by the Richmond railway station, Richmond, and the Jolimont railway station, East Melbourne. It is part of the Melbourne Sports and Entertainment Precinct.

The Shrine of Remembrance is a building with a soul. Opened in 1934, the Shrine is the Victorian state memorial to Australians who served in global conflicts throughout our nation's history. Inspired by Classical architecture, the Shrine was designed and built by veterans of the First World War. A Ray of Light traces its path across the commemorative stone every half hour as it does naturally at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month each year. Special exhibitions and events are held throughout the year providing an ever-changing experience.



Luna Park Melbourne is Melbourne's ultimate family destination for fun. Ideally located next to St Kilda beach, Melbourne's Luna Park is always a great day out for the young and the young at heart.
