 Canadian Community Health Survey 2008-2012


Analysis

- Multivariable logistic regression analysis (merged CCHS 2008-2012)






Mental Health Consultation by Service Provider Type




Amongst Those who Reported Past-Year Mental Health Consultation



- Immigrant populations rely on their family doctor for mental health care
 - Expand targeted outreach of other professionals
 - Increase capacity of family doctors
 - Increase bridging between mainstream services and community care
