



BSN Admission Requirements

Admission to the BSN Program is highly competitive. Students must satisfy the following requirements to be eligible for admission consideration

General acceptance to WCU

- Minimum Cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Accumulate <u>60+ semester hours</u> by program matriculation
- Complete <u>three of the five science</u>
 prerequisites by the application deadline

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- Completion of all course prerequisites before entry into the program
- SAT Critical Reading Score –
 Minimum 500 may be taken twice post-high school graduation
- TEAS exam may be taken once per application cycle (General Studies)







- Funded 3 times!



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
NN-CAT Workforce Diversity Programs

- Based uponMontana StateUniversity Program




Mentee Selection:

- Two page essay on life challenges, reason they would like to be selected
- Socioeconomic issues
- Family support
- Academic progress



Students have been admitted to a special Mentoring **Program that** provides a personal mentor to help facilitate their studies and preparing them for applying to WCU **Nursing School**














Our *WCU program* is based upon the Montana Program:

- *Personal Mentor
- *Guided Tutoring
- *Focused 2-3 study meetings with mentor a month
- *TEAS/SAT Study with Mentor
- * Weekly phone/email contact -mentor









- Scholarship of \$4000 per student
- \$250 *Stipend* per month for 10 months(living)
- Coordination of study time with mentor and their prenursing advisor
- Career guidance from mentor for nursing specialties

- To become a nurse, it takes student dedication, devotion to study, and passion to care for others!
- We will <u>guide</u> them with <u>their mentor</u> to strive for <u>academic success</u> and a <u>successful</u> <u>nursing career</u>!





- Students presenting with already low GPA
- School requirements of needing 500 for SAT Critical Reading
- Guiding student to selfadvocate for themselves



- Enriched program showcasing science (biology and environmental biology) and patient care scenarios






- Program focuses upon native plants, trees, of rural Western North Carolina

- 140 students






